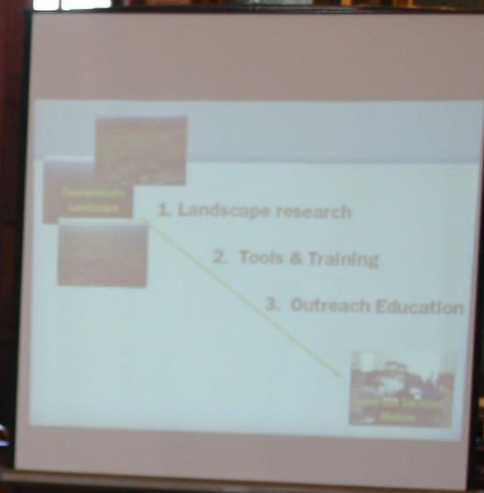

vessels, small and swift, for coastal defense. In 1776 one, the Spy, under Capt. Robert Miles, slipped the treaty alliance thru a blockade to France. Norwich men built the Shark 1776 under Jonathan Lester, and the famous frigate Confederacy 1778. Any rigging was supervised by Ezra Huntington and Ephraim Bill. Sailing flourished protected by defenses. Peace increased prize-taking, but a new war was declared. Their vessels confiscated, to manufacturing plants. Its base on rocky point, led to steam.
