TRBP Coordinator's Report

TRBP has committed to assist with education and outreach as a partner in a Regional Conservation Partnership Project grant awarded to The Last Green Valley. This commitment was compatible with the TRBP 2012 – 2015 Plan of Work. This is a two year commitment. Updated Plan of Work will need to reflect this.

TRBP website update: TRBP already uses the services of Go Daddy to host the website. It was learned that for an additional monthly fee, TRBP can create a WordPress website with fully managed hosting, setup and security. Costs range from \$1.00 per month for a basic site to \$29.99/month for a professional site. CT Envirothon is considering transition to Word Press. TLGV new website uses WordPress. Pros of using this platform include:

- Multi-user access to manage website with login and password
- No software to purchase
- Go Daddy has webpage templates
- Compatible with smart phone users

Funding for coordinator time to transition website to new platform is the limiting factor. TRBP Coordinator will seek funding to fund website redesign.

TRPB Partners presented updates on their activities compatible with the TRBP Plan of Work. These activities were compiled in a separate Winter 2015 TRBP Partners in Action Report.

Partners reviewed the 2012 – 2015 TRBP Plan of Work and suggested revisions. TRBP Coordinator will contact Partner representatives not in attendance and ask for feedback on draft updated draft Plan of Work. The draft Plan of Work to be ready for adoption by April TRBP meeting.

Next meeting is scheduled for April 21, 2015. Meeting location has not been determined. Chris Stone of CT DEEP will give a presentation on the revised MS4 general permit.
