Special Presentation: The Last Green Valley has been working with the CT Land Conservation Council and land trusts throughout eastern Connecticut to develop a web-based regional conservation mapping system to assist with prioritizing landscape scale projects.

The Mapper has been developed by Brian Hall, a GIS specialist consulting for Harvard Forest, and is an outgrowth of the mapping systems he created for MassConn, the Southern New England Heritage Forest and other regional conservation partnerships throughout New England.

The Mapper contains data layers ranging from parcels and social justice to water quality, farmland soils and ecological integrity. Land trusts in eastern Connecticut have updated their protected parcels so this Mapper contains the best protected open space data layer currently available for eastern Connecticut.

Brian and Hunter Brawley, Brawley Consulting Group, will demonstrate the Mapper, discuss existing data layers and potential additions, and begin a discussion about developing a strategic and comprehensive conservation vision for eastern Connecticut.
